	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- All internal site collections are available for testing. Those site are going through the testing process. Issues are being provided and worked on by the DII team. Some entities are also providing solutions to the issues which is very helpful. Once those are available, the site collection admins can manage those security group lists. <p><i>Can a user group be used beyond a specific site collection?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- No, the user group is specific to the site collection. There is a way programmatically to manage the groups through AD and SharePoint. (Client Side Object Module – CSOM)- Security groups with AD; entities are using universal security groups which will not be used going forward. Instead DII will help users recreate those groups. You will need to provide a CSV with the information and DII will be able to add them to the SP- Changes from 2007 to SharePoint Online; update will be provided in the next couple weeks. <p>Open Discussion and/or Questions:</p> <p><i>Current SharePoint, there's a 20GB site content restriction, additional space comes at a fee, in SharePoint Online is there still a fee?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Yes. <p><i>Is it the fee the same in SharePoint Online?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- TBD – Open question for next week.
